The Internet is a great help if you want to travel. You probably already use the Internet when you want to travel somewhere in your own country. It is also very easy to use the Internet for travelling to other countries. All international airlines have websites, where you can find information about flights, times, and prices. Some airlines may have information in your own language, but they always have pages with information in English. You can usually go to the English pages by clicking on a button that shows the English flag.

If you want to travel by train: no problem! The German website www.bahn.de gives information about trains in all EU countries. The information on the website is available in German, but also in English. And of course, on the Internet you can find information about hotels, about campsites, and even the addresses of many national Deaf organisations and Deaf clubs.
